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### **Answering The Research Question Quantitative**

A quantitative research question is usually followed by a hypothesis — this is a prediction of what we think our study will find; a statement that answers the initial speculative research question. In quantitative research, you usually work with at least two variables. It is important that one of those variables is an independent variable (IV).

When composing a research question, a researcher needs to determine if they want to describe data, compare differences among groups, assess a relationship, or determine if a set of variables predict another variable.

## **What Are Typical Quantitative Research Questions? - The ...**

Whilst we refer to this type of quantitative research question as a relationship-based research question, the word relationship should be treated simply as a useful way of describing the fact that these types of quantitative research question are interested in the causal relationships, associations, trends and/or interactions amongst two or more variables on one or more groups.

The type of quantitative research question that you use in your dissertation (i.e., descriptive, comparative and/or relationship-based) needs to be reflected in the way that you write out the research question; that is, the word choice and phrasing that you use when constructing a research question tells the reader whether it is a descriptive, comparative or relationship-based research question.

Both methodologies have merit, but you need to decide which one is more appropriate to use for your specific research problem.

Quantitative questions are easier to measure and easier for survey takers to answer. Qualitative questions on the other hand, are subjective and harder to measure. They are also

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harder for survey-takers to answer and can cause survey fatigue.

### **Developing Your Research Questions**

A research question is 'a question that a research project sets out to answer'. Choosing a research question is an essential element of both quantitative and qualitative research. Investigation will require data collection and analysis, and the methodology for this will vary widely. Good research questions

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seek to improve knowledge on an important topic, and are usually narrow and specific. To form a research question, one must determine what type of study will be conducted such as a qualitative

Both forms include variables that are described, related, categorized into groups for comparison, and the independent and dependent variables are measured separately. In many quantitative proposals, writers use research questions; however, a more formal statement of research employs

### **MIXED METHODS RESEARCH QUESTIONS AND HYPOTHESES**

Quantitative survey questions are defined as objective questions used to gain detailed insights from respondents about a survey research topic. The answers received for these quantitative survey questions are analyzed and a research report is generated on the basis of this quantitative data .

Quantitative questions will result in data that is easy to convert into objective, numbers-based analysis. Quantitative data is easier to measure using statistical analysis, because you can (usually) assign numeric values and directly compare different answers to the same questions.
